

## PRAYER AND PENANCE PRESCRIBED FOR LAY MEMBERS OF THE ORDER OF PREACHERS

I. Prayer:

A. Daily:

1. minimum: An "Our Father," "Hail Mary," and "Eternal Rest" for all the deceased members of the Order of Preachers; five decades of the Rosary.

2. Ideally:

a. Daily Mass and Communion [or when impeded therefrom, a visit to the Blessed Sacrament and an Act of Spiritual

Communion].

b.One of the following:

i. The Liturgy of the Hours: [Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer, and as many of the remaining three hours as possible, viz. Readings, Middav Prayer and Night Prayer].

ii. An approved short version of the Liturgy of the Hours. The Little Office of the Blessed Virgin Mary. iii. Some other approved Little Office, Je.g. that of St.

Dominicl.

iv. Fifteen minutes of thoughtful Scripture reading.

v. The fifteen decades of the Rosary.

c. Fifteen minutes of mental prayer.

d. A prayer, be it ever so short, addressed to Mary as our special Protrectress, to St. Dominic as our -Father, and to St. Catherine of Siena as Patroness of the Third Order.

- B. Weekly: Minimally, Sunday Mass and Communion.
- C. Monthly: Confession, preferably to one's regular confessor, and if possible to a Dominican; at the monthly meeting: part (of the Liturgy of the Hours or) of the Office of the B.V.M. or, when appropriate, part of the Office for the Dead; absolution from faults against the Rule; (five decades of the Rosary, at least in May and Oct.; Scripture sharing is recommended); if possible Benediction or, preferably, Holy Mass.
- Annually: a three day retreat; three Masses are to be arranged for and/or assisted at for all deceased Dominicans.
- F. Occasionally throughout the year: days of prayer and recollection; Office for the Dead on Feb. 7 for deceased fathers and mothers of all Dominicans, Sept. 5 for deceased friends and benefactors of the Order, on Nov. 8 for all deceased Dominicans.
  - G. Upon the death of a member of the Chapter: participation with the Chapter at the wake, especially the Rosary, and the funeral, or when impeded therefrom, offering up a Mass and a Rosary for the deceased within eight days of notification. For a departed Dominican, the Office for the Dead may be said in place of the Office of the day.





II. Penance: abstinence from meat on Fridays, and fasting on Oct. 6, Aug. 7 and April 28, i.e. on the day before the Feasts of Our Lady of Rosary, St. Dominic Our Father, and St. Catherine of Siena. < Compiled <u>April</u> 15, 1983, at DHS, Washington, D.C.>
